The 15-minute rest stop is located in every direction at Silverthorne. Reservations can be made for stops on I-70 and Youngfield Street in west Denver, or the cities of Silverthorne and Kremmling (more information below). All services at these locations must be prearranged and paid in advance. All pick-ups at I-70 & Youngfield, Silverthorne and Kremmling are only per booking. We do not provide service from I-70 & Youngfield to DIA, or from DIA to I-70 & Youngfield. Private vehicle service and prices IMPORTANT INFORMATION It is approximately 280 miles (290 kilometers) from Denver to Steamboat Springs. The driving time is usually 4 to 4.5 hours, depending on traffic, road and weather conditions. That's why we can't be held responsible for missed flights. The DIA recommends arriving at the airport at least 2 hours before all departures. We recommend that you be late for your departure from the Springs steamboat at least 6 hours before departure of your flight, especially on Sunday afternoons during winter summer seasons due to the possibility of heavy traffic.. DIA Arrival Information: Get to know our transport in the DIA on the east side of baggage claim level (level 5), gate 513, island 1 (designated as mountain carrier). Departure information: The transfer time in your steamer accommodation starts 50 minutes before the scheduled departure time for transportation. Times are based on location and will be determined in advance when you book. Baggage policy: According to airline standards, Go Alpine provides free 2 pieces of bag-sized luggage (including a ski bag as one of two) and one personal item per passenger. Each piece of luggage thereafter will be charged \$20 each. KEEP ON YOUR ASS: On each trip we send vehicles that are large enough to accommodate the number of people who have made reservations. Pick Up & Drop Off Info for I-70/Youngfield, Silverthorne and Kremmling I-70 & Youngfield - The Phillips 66 Gas Station/My Goods Market at I-70 and Youngfield (12851 W 32nd Ave, Golden, CO 80401). Parking is only for customers in the store, so you need to arrange transportation. We don't stop here unless someone's booked. Silverthorne - Kum and Go gas station on Interstate 9 (at the corner of Interstate 9 and Ruby Ranch Road). Our Denver shuttles usually rest here, but you need to book in advance to be guaranteed a seat going to Denver or Steamboat. Kremmling - Kum and Go gas station on Highway 40. We don't stop here unless someone's booked. Prices do not include driver tip. \* Prices are subject to change and approval by Colorado P.U.C. Prices shown above are for shared-ride service. The ride to steamboat Springs Steamboat Springs is a scenic 157-mile drive west of Denver. The views are spectacular along the I-70 corridor and bunny ears and it is not uncommon for travelers to see wildlife, including elk, mountain goats, large horn sheep, eagles and deer. There are several scenic route options to choose from for a ride in the Yampa Valley. With Yampa Valley Regional Airport (Steamboat/Hayden HDN) located just 20 miles from the city, Steamboat is a Rocky Mountain destination conveniently reached from anywhere. The ultra-spacious terminal property will greet passengers upon arrival. Steamboat offers year-round air service with convenient connections across the country. Yampa Valley Regional Airport Another option, Denver International Airport is located about 160 miles east of Steamboat Springs, and most major airlines service dia from domestic and international locations around the world. Check out the options below to start planning your scenic journey. Steamboat/Hayden Steamboat/Hayden Airport is located just a few miles east of Hayden and about 12 miles west of steamboat Springs off Interstate 40. From the airport, take an access road about 2 miles to Highway 40 and turn right. The steamboat is about 15 miles to the east. However, there is no public bus service from the airport, and shuttle services are also available. From Denver Steamboat Springs, Colorado is about 157 miles northwest of Denver or an easy 3-hour drive. Take I 70 West through the Eisenhower Tunnel to Silverthorne, exit 205 (67 miles). At the exit, follow CO 9 North towards Kremmling (37 miles). In Kremmling, head west along US 40 to Steamboat Springs (53 miles). Scenic Drive Options Denver Take 70 from Denver for U.S. access- 40 West to Winter Park. Stay in the U.S. - 40 West and end up on Berthoud Berthoud's high peaks and winter park, Colorado. Continue to the U.S. - 40 West for another two hours along the Colorado River, which leads to Rabbit Ears Pass and down to Steamboat Springs. (About 3.5 hours) Have you always wanted to see Rocky Mountain National Park? Take the park by ride from Denver International Airport to Steamboat Springs. Please note that this will take about 5.5 hours to drive. Take the E470 North (toll road) from Denver International Airport. Exit I 25 North to Fort Collins. Exit to the USA - 34 West to Loveland. Continue in the USA - 34 west to Estes Park. Estes Park is the entrance to Rocky Mountain National Park. Drive through a park in the US - 34 West where you'll peak at 12,000 feet with stunning views of the Rocky Mountains often see moose, elk, and bighorn sheep. Viewing areas and Visitor Center options are available. After you pass through the park, stay on the US - 34 West towards Granby. Take US-40 West of Granby to Steamboat Springs, CO. 130 miles northwest of Colorado Springs. Take I 25 north to C 470 (53 miles) then C 470 west to I 70 west (15 miles). Take I 70 west through the Eisenhower Tunnel to Silverthorne Exit 205 (67 miles). Take CO 9 North to Kremmling (37 miles) and then west on US 40 to Steamboat Springs (33 miles). Alternative routes take this route if US 40 via Rabbit Ears Pass is closed and you come from Denver or Colorado Springs. I-70 west through the Eisenhower Tunnel to Silverthorne, exit 205 (67 miles). Take CO 9 north to Kremmling (37 miles). Head west on US 40 to the intersection with CO 134 (6 miles). Turn left and go over Up Pass (CO 134). In Toponas, take Colorado 131 north to Steamboat Springs (40 miles). Or, I took 70 west (through Vail) to exit 157. Take CO 131 North to Steamboat Springs (75 miles) and then left at US 40 into town (4 miles). From Ft. Collins Take CO. 14 West, through Poudre Canyon, through Cameron Pass to Walden, CO. Take co 14 (according to Steamboat Springs) to US 40, and turn right (west) over Muddy and Rabbit Ears passes on steamboat Springs. From Grand Junction Take I 70 West through Glenwood Springs and Eagle to Exit 157 (117 miles). Take CO 131 North (75 miles) to US 40. Turn left on US 40 at Steamboat Springs (4 miles). From Park City/Salt Lake City, UT Take US 40/UT 189 South to Heber City, UT. Stay at US 40, Steamboat Springs is about 5 1/2 hours from Park City. From Laramie, Wyoming Take WY 230 West (snow range exit) through Mountain Home to the Wyoming-Colorado border, the road changes to CO 127. Stay on CO 127 in Walden. Take CO 14 West to US 40 on Muddy Pass and Rabbit Ears Pass to Steamboat Springs. Springs.
